

PART ONE - COMMUNIO

The Christian Mass service is a living, breathing rite; a ritual that has its roots in the last supper in c.30AD, and that has developed organically over centuries into what is a piece of theatre as much as an act of devotion. In its current form, the service is such that the particular musical and rhetorical elements are arranged to create a sense of drama and climax as the Mass unfolds. This shape, and its different textual components, are the basis of our concert programme. From plainchant introit, through mass movements by the great composers of the Renaissance, to a creed which speaks to modern issues and a musical sermon which sets ancient oratory in contemporary musical language, Communio is a sequence that explores some of the greatest compositions of the last thousand years. Come with us to explore this remarkable ritual in the best way we know: through its music.

The King's Singers are consistently welcomed on the world's great stages today and have been throughout their history. They are ambassadors for musical excellence around the globe and have an ongoing commit-



ment to new music that has resulted in an extraordinary wealth of original works as well as leading to some fantastic collaborations.

The King's Singers were founded on 1 May 1968, when choral scholars who had recently graduated from King's College, Cambridge, gave a concert at the Queen Elizabeth Hall at the Southbank Centre in London. Formed in Cambridge, the group had been singing together for some years in a range of line-ups under a different name, but this London debut was the catalyst for a five-decade-long career. Their vocal make-up was, by chance, two countertenors, a tenor, two baritones and a bass, and the group has never wavered from this formation since.

As former members of the Choir of King's College, Cambridge, traditional choral repertoire pulsed through the veins of the founding King's Singers, though what distinguished The King's Singers in the early years was their musical versatility. They were a weekly fixture on prime-time television, celebrating popular music never usually touched by choral ensembles, and their unique British charm, combined with their precise musical craft, captured audiences' hearts the world over. The group has regularly performed at venues from London's Royal Albert Hall to Sydney Opera House, Carnegie Hall to the National Centre for the Performing Arts in Beijing, and the Concertgebouw, Amsterdam.

The King's Singers have accumulated many glowing reviews from the world's great musical publications, two Grammy® Awards, an Emmy® Award, and place in Gramophone magazine's inaugural Hall of Fame, among numerous other awards.

In their early years, the group's sound was informed by the work of arrangers like

Gordon Langford, Daryl Runswick and Goff Richards, many of whom had worked extensively with brass bands. Writing for voices with this specific experience helped to develop the blended 'close-harmony' sound that has become a hall-mark for so many King's Singers performances and recordings since. In more recent times, individual King's Singers such as Philip Lawson and Bob Chilcott have written music prolifically from within the group. This music sits alongside a panoply of commissioned works by many superb composers of the 20th and 21st centuries – including Sir John Tavener, György Ligeti, Toru Takemitsu, John Rutter, Luciano Berio, Nico Muhly and Eric Whitacre. The group's mission has always been to expand their repertoire with the aim of sharing their new music with ensembles and choirs of all kinds around the world. Much of their commissioned repertoire and arrangements are available in print through the publisher Hal Leonard. Over two million items from their King's Singers collection have been shared with their customers worldwide.

This ongoing commitment to spreading great music incorporates a lot of teaching, both on tour and at home. In 2019, the group will lead workshops & masterclasses across the world as they travel. Week-long residential courses now also take an important place in their annual calendar, when the six King's Singers work with groups and individuals on the techniques of ensemble singing that have governed how they make music to this day. Their next Summer School will take place in the beautiful Cambridge University, the home of The King's Singers, in July 2019.

With 2018 marking the 50th birthday of the group, The King's Singers have been celebrating their GOLD anniversary, which acknowledges their amazing musical heritage, as well as the bright future of vocal music in all its forms as they move into 2019. The world may have changed a lot in the fifty years since the original King's Singers came together, but today's group still aims to radiate the joy that singing brings them every day. The King's Singers are as determined as ever to inspire audiences with virtuosity and their vision for an exciting musical future.

Music in the Somerset Hills (MISH) is a musical community whose mission is to create musical experiences of the highest quality for those who live and work in the Somerset Hills and the surrounding area. Founded in 2010 by Artistic Director Stephen Sands, MISH's primary focus is the Somerset Hills Community Chorus, The Concert Series and Music Education.

The Somerset Hills Chorus is open to anyone aged 14 and upwards, with or without expertise, and enables young performers to sing extraordinary repertoire alongside more seasoned professionals in fine venues within and around the community.

The Concert Series brings accomplished professional musicians to perform with the Chorus in local venues. Since 2010, performances have included the Vivaldi Gloria, Handel's Semele and Messiah, a centenary concert of works by Benjamin Britten, a jazz concert of George Shearing works, the Fauré Requiem, Bach's St. John Passion, Music of the Movies (with Peter Dinklage), and, in 2018, a Bernstein Centenary concert. The Concert Series also includes performances by distinguished visitors - Christmas concerts by Chanticleer (2016) and Canadian Brass (2017), as well as occasional, outdoor concerts in the summer, including Handel's Water Music on the Lake at Far Hills in 2017.

Music Education centers on an Early Childhood Music Program, which runs classes for children up to 8-years old. MISH also runs Summer Music Camps for children, including the very popular Summer Voices camp for children and teens in August each year. A guitar workshop is available for adult participation. And MISH offers scholarships to high school seniors who demonstrate musical excellence.

MUSIC IN THE SOMERSET HILLS



Stephen Sands, Music in the Somerset Hills founder and Artistic Director is highly sought after as a soloist, conductor, music educator and ensemble member. He holds his Bachelors and Masters degrees from Westminster Choir College. Stephen is the director of Downtown Voices, a semi-pro choral group that is part of the Trinity Wall Street Music program, focused on bringing the best volunteer and professional singers in the NYC area together for high level performances. He has taught choral music to thousands of students in grades 3-12 in the Somerset Hills School District for more than 20 years, and is a founding member and executive director of the internationally acclaimed Antioch Chamber Ensemble. Stephen sings with the Grammy-nominated Trinity Choir in New York. He has been praised as a "crystalline tenor" (Backstage) and "a tenor with a focused, powerful tone" who sings with "subtlety" and "poignancy" by the New York

Times. Stephen has been heard as the Evangelist and tenor soloist in numerous performances of Bach's sacred orato rios, most recently with the Trinity Choir and Baroque Orchestra in the St. John Passion of J.S. Bach. StephenSands.net

Richard Somerset-Ward, President, was, for 21 years, on the staff of the British Broadcasting Corporation, latterly as Head of Music & Arts Programming. He has lived in the United States since 1984 and is the author of The Story of Opera (Abrams 1998) and Angels & Monsters: Male and Female Sopranos in the Story of Opera (Yale 2004).



Billy Webster, General Manager, earned his BA in Literature and Theater Arts at

Hunter College in Manhattan and his Master of Divinity at Princeton Theological Seminary. For seven years he served as Director of Admissions at The General Theological Seminary in New York City. His ninth album of original music, "Eat Your Heart Out", was released in December. Billy's rock opera based on The Lord's Prayer entitled "Bold Enough To Say", made its live debut in Brooklyn in October 2014.

Pamela L. Nardone, Chair of Development, has been a part of Music in the Somerset Hills, almost from the beginning, as a member of

its Community Chorus. Her singing and performing go all the way back to her early school years and have never stopped, simply for the pure joy it brings her. In addition to the Somerset Hills Chorus, she also sings in the choir of St. Luke's, Gladstone, and rings in their Bell Choir. She has day jobs, too: she owns and operates Hibernate Bedding in Bernardsville and helps to manage BORREGAARD of Gladstone.
